BIRDSCAPING- Creating wildlife habitat using native plantings and bird feeding stations.

Session # 2 10:30 AM- Birdscaping Your Backyard:

- Plant vertically for nectar feeders (trumpet honeysuckle)
- Hummingbirds like red (cardinal, salvia)
- Track the spring migration

- Plant with these needs in mind (shelter, food, and nesting). Create a brush pile.
- Plant flowers that bloom and seed from spring to fall. Add flowering trees and shrubs.
- Fruiting trees and shrubs are important for spring/ fall migrating birds. Winter food too.

- Early spring foods to try (oranges, jelly, sugar water) and mealworms.
- Try adding a birdbath or a hummingbird feeder to a small flower bed.
- Use larger more permanent bird feeding stations with larger fruiting shrubs/trees.
- To minimize squirrels away from feeders you should have 8-10' clear radius.
- The type of feeder and seed used can increase the number and variety of birds.
- Certify your backyard as wildlife habitat <u>http://</u> www.nwf.org/gardenforwildlife/certify.cfm
